Mark Rylance is the Big Friendly Giant, a gentle, kind and humorous giant who becomes unlikely friends with ten-year-old Sophie. But as their friendship grows, her presence attracts the unwanted attention of the bigger, badder giants: Bloodbottler, Fleshlumpeater and more. Can she and the BFG outwit them once and for all?

REEL FILM: KING KONG (PG)

Ignore the remakes - the 1933 Pre-Code original *King Kong* is a masterpiece, the ultimate adventure fantasy. In fact its technical effects are still impressive, as are its thrilling story (by Edgar Wallace) and script, culminating in one of cinema's classic last lines. Actress Ann Darrow (Fay Wray) and director Carl Denham (Robert Armstrong) travel to the tropics to shoot a new film. Along the way, Ann meets and falls for rugged First Mate John Driscoll (Bruce Cabot). Arriving at a mysterious island, she's taken hostage by natives who prepare her to meet the enormous ape who rules their jungle. But it's when she's rescued and Kong captured that the real trouble begins.

A successful young couple's comfortable lives are disrupted and their relationship challenged when they each make a decision to ignore the plight of a troubled teenage girl. Indie pioneer Jim Jarmusch's (*Down by Law, Ghost Dog: Way of the Samurai*) riotous documentary *Gimme Danger* chronicles the story of Iggy Pop and The Stooges, one of the greatest rock 'n' roll bands of all time. Emerging from Michigan amidst a countercultural revolution, The Stooges' powerful and aggressive style blew a crater in the musical landscape of the late 1960s. Assaulting audiences with a blend of rock, blues, R&B, and free jazz, the band planted the seeds for what would be called punk and alternative rock in the decades that followed. It's an evocative and effortlessly entertaining story.

David Oyelowo and Rosamund Pike star in the powerful new drama from British director Amma Asante (Belle), based on an extraordinary true story. In 1947, the King of Bechuanaland (Oyelowo) falls in love with a British office worker (Pike). Their controversial union generates fierce opposition from the British and South African governments as well as their families – but Seretse and Ruth defy family, apartheid and Empire to stay together. Exploring the intersect between a particular story and its universal affect, *A United Kingdom* charts a complex and painful chapter in Britain's social history.

Stephen Strange is a neurosurgeon whose life changes forever after a horrific car accident robs him of the use of his hands. Failed by traditional medicine he looks for healing in a mysterious enclave known as Kamar-Taj; which he quickly finds is the front line for a battle against unseen dark forces. Acquiring astonishing magical powers, Strange must choose whether to return to his former life or defend the world as the most vital sorcerer in existence.

Oscar-winner Tom Hanks gives one of his most effortlessly charming

Desperate to grow up, 12-year-old Josh Baskin (David Moscow) is nevertheless unprepared when he gets his wish and becomes a 30-year-old man (Hanks) overnight. Heading to New York and getting a job at MacMillen Toy Company, a chance encounter with the owner (Robert Loggia) leads to a promotion. Soon a fellow employee, Susan Lawrence (Elizabeth Perkins), starts falling for Josh. But as the pressures of adult life begin to overwhelm him, he dreams of a return to his simple, former life as a boy. The screening will include FREE refreshments relevant to the film.

The luminous, piercing new drama by *Coco Before Chanel* director Anne Fontaine is based on a haunting true story and set in a convent in a ravaged Poland at the end of WWII. Mathilde (Lou de Laâge), a young French Red Cross doctor is sent to help concentration camp survivors outside Warsaw. Visiting a nearby convent, she makes a disquieting discovery about what happened to its nuns during the war, and is begged to help them. Provoking comparisons to Pawel Pawlikowski's Oscar-winning *Ida*, Fontaine's film is immensely moving and full of grace.

FANTASTIC BEASTS AND WHERE TO FIND THEM (12A)*

Based on J. K. Rowling's Harry Potter spin-off novel series (and adapted by Rowling herself), director David Yates's *Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them* is full of wizardry; an intricately realised world to please all Potter fans. In 1926, Newt Scamander (Eddie Redmayne) arrives at the US Magical Congress for a meeting. A magically expanded briefcase full of dangerous creatures is brought to this meeting and when the creatures accidentally escape, the American wizarding authorities come after Newt, who must correct the mistake and prevent the horrors of an increase in violence and tensions felt between magical and non-magical peoples.

pitch-perfect performance in Jim Jarmusch's (*Only Lovers Left Alive*) profoundly enjoyable *Paterson* as a New Jersey bus driver-cum-poet, writing verse around his day job and life with his wife Laura (Golshifteh Farahani). A paean to the gentle delights of small-town American life, it's surely one of the year's most purely pleasurable films. "Will be treasured for years" ***** Tim Robey, Telegraph

TEATIME CLASSICS: CASABLANCA (U)

A noirish romance filmed and set during WWII, *Casablanca*'s appeal never fades. Humphrey Bogart (African Queen) epitomises laconic cool as expat Rick Blaine, running a nightclub in Casablanca and treading a difficult line with Vichy and Gestapo forces when his old lover Ilsa (Ingrid Bergman) walks through the door. Perfect casting, nostalgic songs and an endlessly quotable script; it's a truly sublime film.

A STREET CAT NAMED BOB (12A)*

Rising British star Luke Treadaway and *Downton Abbey*'s Joanne Froggatt star in this heartwarming true story (based on the international best seller) about a recovering drug addict whose life is transformed when he adopts a stray ginger cat. James Bowen struggled for years, unable to break the cycle of addiction, until he met Bob. Allowing the affectionate moggy into his life and taking him everywhere on his journeys busking and Big Issue-selling around London (the duo were for years a familiar sight around the city), his love for Bob gives him hope, ambition and a lust for life for the very first time.

Tom Hanks stars in Clint Eastwood's (*Million Dollar Baby*) sober, compelling and thrillingly naturalistic biopic re-enacting the astonishing events of 15th January 2009, when Captain Chesley "Sully" Sullenberger made an emergency landing in New York's Hudson River after the flight he was co-piloting struck a flock of geese. Afterwards – having saved 155 passengers and crew and led them through a harrowing ordeal – Sullenberger became a national hero in the eyes of the public and the media, but despite the accolades, faces an investigation that threatens to destroy his career and reputation.
