Casey Affleck is Lee, a Boston janitor who after a family tragedy, returns to his North Shore hometown to visit his nephew. There, he takes on new responsibilities while coming back into contact with his ex-wife Randi (Michelle Williams) and confronting the weight of the past. Evincing an eye for comedy against tragedy and a sprawling, yet specific interest in the texture of real life, this is perhaps Lonergan's most fully realised film to date, offering us a glimpse into a near complete, emotionally overwhelming world.

Scared and angry, he's confronted one night by a monstrous tree come to life (voiced by Neeson). With shades of Guillermo Del Toro's gothic inventiveness, A Monster Calls is overwhelmingly moving; combining superbly pitched drama with beautiful watercolour animation, it's a fantastical tale of real-life tragedies and truths for all ages.

She plays Jackie as Jackie played herself: a controlling and very private woman who fully understood the business of mythmaking via Camelot's image of youth, beauty and grace. But after his brutal murder she must cope with unimaginable trauma and define her family's legacy, all while being watched by millions. A startlingly, eerie and brilliant film documenting one of the most incendiary chapters in American history.

A highly original, utterly hilarious film.

MOONLIGHT (Cert TBC)

Hotly tipped for awards season, Barry Jenkins's Moonlight is a revelation. It tells its beautiful, vital and devastating story in three acts: following a young African-American boy from childhood to



adulthood in Miami, as he deals with homophobic bullying, his mother's (Naomie Harris) crack addiction and his own terrifying vulnerability. Full of extraordinary performances, aesthetically striking and viscerally powerful, Moonlight is a breathtaking achievement.

HACKSAW RIDGE (15)

Andrew Garfield (Silence) gives an emphatic, Golden Globe-nominated performance in Mel Gibson's (Apocalypto) fantastic, bruising World War II epic Hacksaw Ridge. Based on an

astounding true story, Garfield plays Desmond Doss, a Seventh Day Adventist combat medic and conscientious objector who must save his fellow soldiers amid the epic Battle of Okinawa with no way of defending himself.
