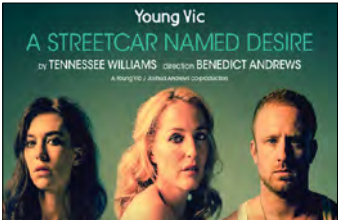

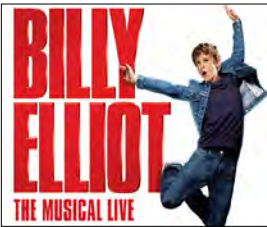

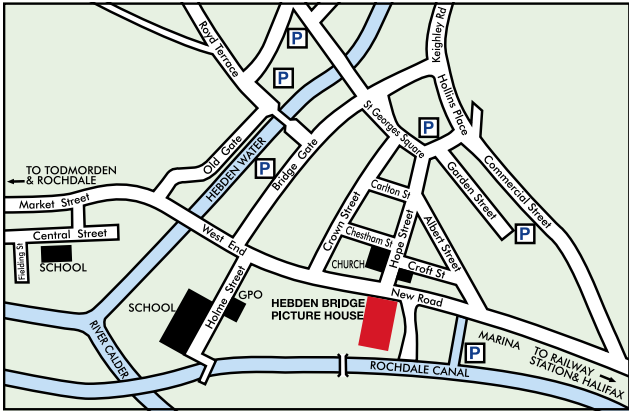
THE PICTURE HOUSE

Jay (James Buckley) is on a gap year and emails his classmates promising them 'sex on tap' if they fly over – unsurprisingly, he turns out to be exaggerating just a bit. What follows is the familiar mixture of hapless adventures and utterly hilarious comedy that made the original so successful.



LILTING (15)

Ben Whishaw (**Bright Star**) and Cheng Pei Pei (**Crouching Tiger, Hidden Dragon**) star in Hong Khaou’s soulful drama about a Chinese-Cambodian woman (Pei Pei) mourning her son’s death alone, until his former boyfriend (Whishaw) gets in touch... Lyrical and suffused with tenderness, Lilting is superbly eloquent on loss, alienation, contemporary young gay relationships and cultural divides.



WAKOLDA (12A)

Set in 1960s Patagonia, Lucia Puenzo’s (**XXY**) gripping *Wakolda* follows Helmut, a German doctor who befriends an Argentinian family and moves into their new hotel. Charismatic and kind to them – he offers to treat young Lilith, whose body is too small for her age and is accepted into the community until they discover he is hiding a shockingly terrible past.

HECTOR AND THE SEARCH FOR HAPPINESS (15)

Simon Pegg (**Hot Fuzz**) stars as quirky psychiatrist Hector in this enjoyable comedy-drama. Hector is bored and feels a fraud; as he tells his girlfriend Clara (Rosamund Pike), he hasn't really tasted life, and yet he's dispensing advice to patients. So he decides to travel and try and uncover the elusive formula for true happiness – with riotously funny results.



PLANES 2: FIRE AND RESCUE * (U)

The sequel to 2011’s **Planes**. When famous air racer Dusty (voiced by Dane Cook) damages his engine, he joins the world of aerial firefighting. Protecting a historic park, he joins an elite crew including rescue helicopter Blade Ranger and air tanker Dipper. Together the team battles a massive wildfire, and Dusty learns what it is to become a true hero.



FINDING VIVIAN MAIER (12A)

This intriguing documentary traces the life of the late Vivian Maier, a career nanny whose previously unknown cache of 100,000 photographs has earned her a posthumous reputation as one of America’s most accomplished street photographers. Her exquisite pictures recall Cartier-Bresson in their luminous immediacy; but she never told anyone of her passion, or showed anybody her work. An extraordinary story.

Loner Eric (Pearce) is travelling the desolate Australian outback when a gang steals his car and leaves behind wounded Rey (Pattinson). Teaming up, the duo then travel in bitter pursuit, with Eric desperate to wreak a terrible revenge.



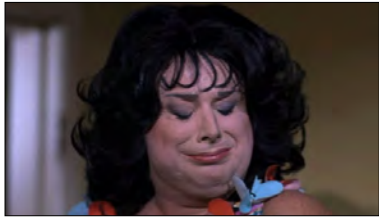
POLYESTER (15)

Presented with Odorama scratch ‘n’ sniff cards, indie provocateur John Waters’ classic is a trashy joy. Divine stars as housewife Francine whose world collapses when her pornographer husband Elmer’s serial infidelities come to light, her daughter gets pregnant, and her glue-sniffing son is outed as an aggressive foot fetishist. Waters’ flagrant, middle-America baiting bad taste is on full show. Marvellous!



THE GRAND SEDUCTION (12A)

Cast | Taylor Kitsch, Brendan Gleeson, Liane Balaban, Gordon Pinsent

This whimsical, charming comedy stars Brendan Gleeson (**The Guard**) as Murray, an unemployed fisherman with a plan. A giant corporation needs a new location and their town, Tickle Head, could be the place – but they need a local doctor to qualify. Can they persuade young American Paul (Taylor Kitsch) that it’s for him? They’ll try anything – even invoking a local romance.



MOOMIN AND MIDSUMMER MADNESS (U)

The enchanting Moomins star in this delightful film. After a hot summer in Moominvalley, they’re getting bored of the weather when a volcanic eruption causes a major flood. Luckily the Moomin family is rescued by a floating house, which turns out to be a magical theatre full of costumes and props – and soon they’re engrossed in the first Moomin stage production



TWO DAYS, ONE NIGHT (15)

Cast: Marion Cotillard, Fabrizio Rongione, Pili Groyne

The latest from social realist masters, the Dardenne brothers (**Rosetta**, **The Child**) stars a superb Marion Cotillard (**La Vie en Rose**) as Sandra, who returns to work after a breakdown to find the management has asked staff to choose between keeping her or their bonuses – and, forcing a vote, she has only a weekend to win their support. Supremely effective drama.



BELIEVE (PG)

Cast | Brian Cox, Natascha McElhone, Toby Stephens, Anne Reid, Philip Jackson, Jack Smith

Believe stars Brian Cox as legendary football manager Sir Matt Busby, who comes out of retirement to coach a team of young working-class boys captained by the talented but unruly Georgie Gallagher (Jack Smith), who become determined to win a local cup tournament against the odds. A cheering, very British story of underdogs triumphing in the beautiful game.



PULP FICTION (18)

Cast | Samuel L. Jackson, John Travolta, Uma Thurman, Bruce Willis

Tarantino’s *Pulp Fiction* is a cinematic joyride, one of the most influential films ever made. Starring Samuel L. Jackson and John Travolta as philosophical hit men, Bruce Willis as a boxer straight out of a 1940s B-movie and Uma Thurman as a gangster’s moll - whose dance sequence with Travolta was an instant classic – *Pulp Fiction* is once seen, never forgotten.



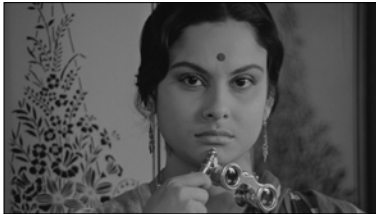
CHARULATA (PG)

Satyajit Ray’s masterpiece *Charulata* was made a year after *Mahanagar* (**The Big City**). Largely ignored by her pretentious husband, Charulata spends her days reading and wandering around her large home, peering at the outside world through ornate opera glasses. When her husband invites his cousin Amal to stay, she’s stirred by his intellect, and starts trying to find her own voice as a writer.



THE HUNDRED FOOT JOURNEY (PG)

Cast | Helen Mirren, Om Puri, Manish Dayal

Helen Mirren and Om Puri star in Lasse Hallström’s rich, romantic drama about a cultural and culinary clash. Puri is father to Hassan, a talented young chef who opens a new Indian restaurant in rural France – but it’s in competition with a Michelin-starred eatery run by Madame Mallory (Mirren). Will it be outright war – or can they weave their disparate tastes together?



THE UNBEATABLES * (U)

Voice cast | Rupert Grint, Anthony Head, Peter Serafinowicz

A superb children’s animation from Juan José Campanella (acclaimed director of the Oscar winning *The Secrets in their Eyes*) sees young Amadeo (voiced by **Harry Potter’s** Rupert Grint) set off on an unexpected adventure with the players of his beloved Foosball game. An inspired family-friendly animation, *The Unbeatables* is a touching, thoughtful story of triumphing against the odds.



FINDING FELA (15)

The story of Afrobeat pioneer and activist Fela Kuti is told in this joyous doc from Oscar-winning Alex Gibney (**We Steal Secrets**). Born in Nigeria, Kuti rose to fame in the ‘70s with Afrobeat, which fused jazz, funk, psychedelic rock and West African chants and formed the sonic backdrop to Africa’s postcolonial activism.



NIGHT MOVES (15)

Cast | Jesse Eisenberg, Dakota Fanning, Peter Sarsgaard

Jesse Eisenberg (**The Social Network**) stars in this provocative film from acclaimed US director Kelly Reichardt (**Wendy and Lucy**) about an eco-activist group planning to blow up a dam that’s damaging the environment. Eisenberg is hyper-intelligent Josh who teams up with rebel Dena (Dakota Fanning) and ex-con Harmon (Peter Sarsgaard) to carry out their crime in this gripping and haunting drama.



PRIDE * (15)

Cast | Imelda Staunton, Andrew Scott, Bill Nighy, Dominic West, Freddie Fox

A supremely enjoyable comedy based on a true story, *Pride*’s stellar ensemble cast includes Bill Nighy, Imelda Staunton and Dominic West. It follows the efforts of LGBT activists who, in 1984 decided to raise money to support the families of the miners on strike throughout the country – despite the industry’s institutional homophobia – resulting in a joyful British comedy of manners.



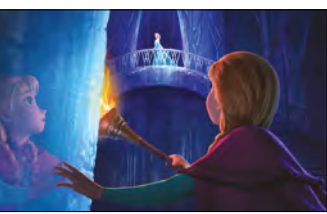
FROZEN - Singalong version (PG)

This superb singalong animation from Disney is a wintry tale, reminiscent of Narnia, and a stunning big screen adventure. It’s the story of fearless Princess Anna (Kristen Bell), who sets off on an epic journey with rugged mountain man Kristoff (Jonathan Groff) to find her sister (Idina Menzel), whose icy powers have trapped the kingdom of Arendelle in eternal winter.



LUCY * (15)

Luc Besson’s (**The Fifth Element**) kinetic, superbly stylish *Lucy* stars an excellent Scarlett Johansson. She is 25-year-old Lucy, living in Taipei when she’s tricked into becoming a drug mule. When a new synthetic drug accidentally enters her bloodstream, she gains enhanced mental and physical capabilities until she is almost all-powerful, and out for revenge. Who can stop her now?



A MOST WANTED MAN (15) COMING SOON

Cast | Philip Seymour Hoffman, Rachel McAdams, Willem Dafoe, Robin Wright

Adapted from a John Le Carré novel by Control director Anton Corbijn, this gripping post-9/11 espionage thriller really delivers. The late Philip Seymour Hoffman is riveting as a cynical German intelligence officer investigating a suspected Chechen terrorist. With excellent supporting performances from Willem Dafoe (a conflicted banker) and Rachel McAdams (his left-wing lawyer) and an intricate plot, it’s a very grown-up thriller.
