From the director of Séraphine comes this haunting biopic of French novelist Violette Leduc, set in Paris in WWII. We watch as she meets and falls for iconic writer and philosopher Simone de Beauvoir, mixes with other luminaries including Sartre, and enjoys a literary breakthrough. A profound and moving study of an artist whose passionate, confessional writing was ahead of its time.

But is this true? Thompson's intelligent screenplay explores further, also detailing Effie's sensational new relationship with painter John Everett Millais.



A supremely enjoyable comedy based on a true story, *Pride’s* stellar ensemble cast includes Bill Nighy, Imelda Staunton and Dominic West. It follows the efforts of LGBT activists who, in 1984 decided to raise money to support the families of the miners on strike throughout the country – despite the industry’s institutional homophobia – resulting in a joyful British comedy of manners.

Luc Besson’s (*The Fifth Element*) kinetic, superbly stylish *Lucy* stars an excellent Scarlett Johansson. She is 25-year-old Lucy, living in Taipei when she’s tricked into becoming a drug mule. When a new synthetic drug accidentally enters her bloodstream, she gains enhanced mental and physical capabilities until she is almost all-powerful, and out for revenge. Who can stop her now?



A MOST WANTED MAN * (15)

Adapted from a John Le Carré novel by Control director Anton Corbijn, this gripping post-9/11 espionage thriller really delivers. The late Philip Seymour Hoffman is riveting as a cynical German intelligence officer investigating a suspected Chechen terrorist. With excellent supporting performances from Willem Dafoe (a conflicted banker) and Rachel McAdams (his left-wing lawyer) and an intricate plot, it’s a very grown-up thriller.



GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY (12A)

This epic, cheeky Marvel space adventure is a great palate-cleanser. Forget the dark tone of most modern superhero flicks – this has a decidedly humorous bent, with Chris Pratt (TV’s *Parks and Recreation*) starring as brash adventurer Peter Quill who finds himself being hunted after stealing a mysterious orb coveted by villain Ronan, whose ambitions threaten the entire universe.

Pawel Pawlikowski’s (*My Summer of Love*) exquisite *Ida* sees a young novice nun visiting her unknown aunt Wanda, a judge and a tough, high-functioning alcoholic, in post-war Poland. Telling Anna that she is really *Ida*, is Jewish, and that her parents were murdered during the war, she takes her niece to find their resting place. It’s a luminously, beautifully and simply told story.



SPELL TO WARD OFF THE DARKNESS (15)

A collaboration between experimental filmmakers Ben Rivers (*Two Years at Sea*) and Ben Russell (*Let Each One Go Where He May*), following a single figure as he wanders through an Estonian commune, ekes out a lone existence in the Finnish wilderness and fronts a metal band in Norway. Hugely arresting, it investigates different ways of life against sublime, otherworldly visual landscapes.
