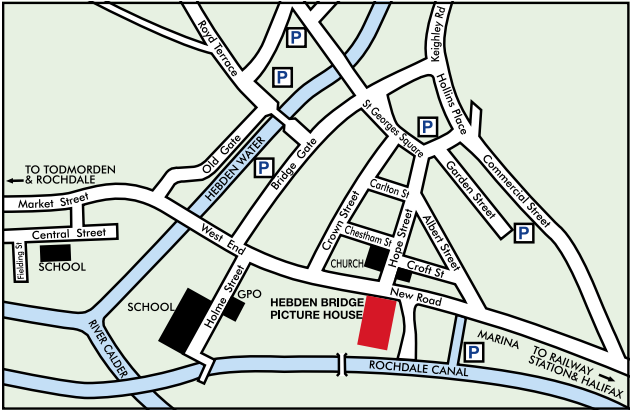
THE PICTURE HOUSE

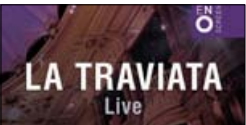

Arriving with incredible buzz, Whiplash is one of the must see titles this season; a superlative character drama with a devastating emotional punch. Miles Teller (**Divergent**) is promising drummer Andrew who faces a stern taskmaster in Fletcher (J. K. Simmons), one of his school's principals, whose ferocious teaching methods force a struggle between them in their shared quest for success. Mesmerising.

SUITE FRANÇAISE (15)

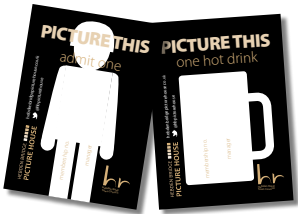

Michelle Williams is superb in the profoundly moving Suite Française, based on Irène Némirovsky's wartime memoirs. It's set in 1944 during the French Occupation; Lucille (Williams) living with her controlling mother-in-law (Kristin Scott Thomas) as they wait for news of her POW husband. When German troops occupy the town one of the commanding officers (Matthias Schoenaerts) is billeted with Lucille, and the two begin a hesitant relationship which brings into focus her true feelings and allegiances.

The kids of St. Bernadette's embark on their craziest adventure yet in this fabulous festive family comedy. When their new teacher Mr Shepherd (Martin Clunes) loses his memory and forgets all about Christmas, as well as his fiancée Sophie (Catherine Tate) and the whereabouts of the beloved Archie the donkey, it's up to the pupils of St Bernadette's to save the day.

THE HOMESMAN (15) Fri 2nd, Sat 3rd & Thurs 8th January

Tommy Lee Jones’ second film as director (after *The Three Burials of Melquiades Estrada*) is this vastly satisfying frontier Western. He plays claim jumper George Briggs, saved from a near-lynching by pious claimswoman Mary Bee Cuddy (Hilary Swank). In her debt, he helps her escort three insane women from Nebraska to Iowa across the Midwestern plains; encountering vigilantes, American Indians and awful weather along the way.

TEENAGE MUTANT NINJA TURTLES\* (12A) Sat 3rd & Sun 4th January

The legendary reptile avengers return for this fast-paced new adventure. New York City is being terrorised by the evil Foot Clan. Ambitious TV reporter April O'Neil (Megan Fox) determines to land a scoop on their criminal activities. But resourceful April instead succeeds in tracking down a heroic quartet of giant reptilian crime-fighters: Raphael (Alan Ritchson), Michelangelo (Noel Fisher), Donatello (Jeremy Howard) and Leonardo (Pete Ploszek).

MANAKAMANA (U) Sun 4th & Tues 6th January

This engrossing documentary observes Hindu pilgrims as they take a spectacular cable car ride – high above the Nepali jungle – on an ancient route to the famed Manakamana temple. The filmmakers have used a very simple format; with passengers telling their stories to camera whilst travelling to this intensely sacred and mystical place – but the cumulative effect is utterly spellbinding.



WINTER SLEEP (15) Sun 4th & Mon 5th January

Winner of the Palme d'Or at Cannes, Winter Sleep is the new film from Turkish master Nuri Bilge Ceylan (*Three Monkeys*). Mesmeric, bold and beautiful, it's about Aydin (Bilginer), a wealthy, retired actor who runs a small hotel in a remote mountain village in central Anatolia, and the inescapable pressures the isolated landscape puts on his marriage.

KON-TIKI (15) Weds 7th & Thurs 8th January

A record of a truly astonishing adventure, Kon-Tiki is based on legendary explorer Thor Heyerdal's epic 4,300-mile crossing of the Pacific on a balsawood raft in 1947, in an effort to prove that it was possible for South Americans to settle in Polynesia in pre-Columbian times. Navigating sharks, storms and the wide open sea, the crew battle nature in order to reach their destination.



BIG EYES (TBC) Fri 9th to Sun 11th and Weds 14th to Thurs 15th January

Tim Burton's latest, a hugely enjoyable, kookily framed biopic, stars Amy Adams as artist Margaret Keane, whose trademark canvases - usually depicting children with huge doe eyes - were fraudulently claimed by her husband Walter (Christoph Waltz) as his own work in the 50s and 60s. But the ruse puts heavy pressure on their marriage, and before long they're headed for court.

THE HOBBIT: THE BATTLE OF THE FIVE ARMIES (12A) Sat 10th to Tues 13th January



Dir: Peter Jackson | New Zealand / USA | 2014 | 144 mins

Cast | Martin Freeman, Ian McKellen, Benedict Cumberbatch, Evangeline Lilly, Cate Blanchett

The third and final instalment of Peter Jackson's epic, bombastic Hobbit series, Bilbo, Thorin and their company of Dwarves are forced to take up arms in a war against a flock of new combatants to prevent the terrifying Smaug from acquiring a kingdom of treasure, and obliterating all of Middle-Earth. Meanwhile, unseen by almost everyone but the wizard Gandalf, the enemy Sauron has returned to Middle-earth and has sent forth legions of Orcs in an attack upon the Lonely Mountain.

THE GRANDMASTER (15) Sun 11th & Thurs 15th January

Wong Kar Wai's superbly stylish, Oscar-nominated film is inspired by the life of legendary Kung Fu master Ip Man (Tony Leung). Born into a wealthy family, Ip's life changes when a Martial Arts Grandmaster names him as heir, bypassing his only child Gong Er (Zhang Ziyi) and igniting a relationship that lasts a lifetime.

THEORY OF EVERYTHING\* (12A) Fri 16th to Thurs 22nd January

Cast | Eddie Redmayne, Felicity Jones, Tom Prior

Eddie Redmayne (*My Week with Marilyn*) is a revelation as young Stephen Hawking in this moving, inspiring biopic of the iconic astrophysicist, based on a memoir by his former wife Jane, excellently played here by Felicity Jones (*Away From Her*). Meeting at Cambridge, they fall deeply in love; afterwards, Stephen embarks on incredibly ambitious scientific work, studying the very thing he now has precious little of - time.



PENGUINS OF MADAGASCAR\* (U) Sat 17th & Sun 18th and Sat 24th & Sun 25th January

After the events of '*Madagascar 3*', the four Penguins, Skipper, Kowalski, Rico and Private are recruited by the North Wind, an elite task force dedicated to helping animals who can't help themselves. Working with specialist undercover agents, they must stop evil octopus Dr. Octavius Brine from taking over the world.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS (15) Sun 18th January

A precise and riveting drama that superbly weaves reality and allegory, Stations of the Cross - named after the series of artistic representations of Christ carrying the cross to his crucifixion – is about the stifling upbringing of a young girl raised in a strict Catholic family and her difficulty in navigating the strictures of her faith and the appeal of normal teenage life.



FOXCATCHER (15) Fri 23rd to Thurs 29th January

Steve Carell (*Little Miss Sunshine*) gives a barnstorming performance in Bennett Miller's (*Capote*) wonderfully dark film dramatising the true story of Olympic Wrestling Champion Mark Schultz (Channing Tatum), his brother Dave (Mark Ruffalo) and their paranoid-schizophrenic coach, John du Pont (Carell). With equally outstanding turns from Tatum and Ruffalo, it's an insightful, resonant study of a twisted American dream.

2001: A SPACE ODYSSEY (U) Sun 25th January

Heralded in 1968 as the most striking sci-fi film ever, Stanley Kubrick's epic meditation on human evolution shines brilliantly 46 years later in a new BFI restoration. A highly evolved civilisation sets up mysterious monolithic objects on Earth, the Moon, and in orbit around Jupiter, which impart vital survival information to ancient man, and later signal man to travel deep into space. When man arrives on the great civilisations planet he is reborn with immense powers of wisdom and strength.

TESTAMENT OF YOUTH (12A) Fri 30th January to Thurs 5th February

Adapted from Vera Brittain's classic memoir, famed for its vivid portrayal of a generation lost to WWI, the indelibly moving Testament of Youth stars Alicia Vikander as the young Vera, showing her as a carefree teenager before the war's shattering impact on her and her contemporaries' lives, futures and dreams.

NIGHT AT THE MUSEUM: SECRET OF THE TOMB\* (PG) Sat 31st January & Sun 1st February

The final entry in the hit trilogy, sees Larry (Ben Stiller) travel to the British Museum to restore the magic which brings his museum exhibit friends to life. The powers of the Tablet of Akhmenrah are beginning to die out, which prompts Larry to embark on a globe-spanning quest to restore them, uniting old and new characters including Theodore Roosevelt (Robin Williams in his final performance), Jedediah (Owen Wilson) and Lancelot (Dan Stevens).

EASTERN BOYS (15) Sun 1st & Thurs 5th February

Robin Campillo, writer of Laurent Cantet's Palme d'Or winner The Class and creator of the acclaimed television series The Returned, directs this tense, erotically charged thriller about a young gay hustler in Paris. Cleverly juxtaposing tonalities, Campillo layers a touching love story over a nail-biting thriller that also observes some of the bleaker aspects of inter-EU immigration.
