ELEVENSES are our weekday morning screenings, where the programme listing is for 10.30am & the feature begins at 11am. All tickets are £6.50 and include a free tea or coffee and a biscuit. **PARENT & BABY** screenings are monthly screenings **exclusively** for parents / carers and their babies aged under 12 months. Tickets are £6.50 and include a tea, coffee or glass of cordial for the grown up. Only adults with babies are admitted.

THE BOX OFFICE opens 15 minutes before the pre-film programme start time shown overleaf in SHOW TIMES (please note the programme starts 30 minutes before the feature), and one hour before the start time shown overleaf for Live Arts and events, marked *. The Box Office remains open for 30 minutes after the film, Live Arts screening or event starts.

THE CINEMA opened in 1921 and is a 527 seat, single screen venue. It is operated by Hebden Royd Town Council on a not-for-profit basis for the community. From a rebellious, heavy metal-loving tomboy experiencing the turmoil of adolescence during the tyrannical, Iranian revolution to a teenage exile in Vienna, Austria, where she discovers the benefits of freedom can be just as shocking as the repressive regime she was forced to leave behind. **F Rated.**

1933. Gareth Jones (James Norton) is an ambitious young Welsh journalist who gained fame after his report on being the first foreign journalist to fly with Hitler. Whilst working as an advisor to Lloyd George, he is now looking for his next big story. The Soviet "utopia" is all over the news, and Jones is intrigued as to how Stalin is financing the rapid modernisation of the Soviet Union. **F Rated.**



UNITED NATION, THREE DECADES OF DRUM & BASS (15)

The life of a military wife can be thankless. Separated from loved ones and staring down the barrel of anxiety and loneliness, their quiet bravery and sacrifice unnoticed while they live with the dread of a fateful knock on the door. But Kate (Kristin Scott Thomas), the perfect officer's wife, bears it all with grace and stoicism. She finds freedom in song; and persuades a disparate group of women on the base to form the Military Wives Choir. Initially sceptical and embarrassed by such an amateur bunch, newcomer Lisa (Sharon Horgan), a rebel and rocker to the core, is quickly transformed by the choir's friendship, humour and courage.
