

WELCOME TO THE PICTURE HOUSE



The Picture House is a single screen cinema built in 1921 and seating over 500, showing mainstream, art-house, family, classic and foreign language films and broadcasting live theatre, music, opera and ballet on to the big screen. We're open every evening, weekend afternoons, Thursday mornings and for matinees during the school holidays. We have a kiosk and bar serving hot, cold and alcoholic drinks, sweet and savoury snacks, ice creams, cakes and popcorn – cash only please. Please do not bring your own food and drink into the cinema.

ACCESSIBILITY

We are wheelchair accessible; access is via a ramp to the right hand (park) side of the building, using a RADAR key or calling 01422 842807 to alert a staff member to gain admission. An accessible toilet is located in the foyer (accessed via the auditorium). We have 4 wheelchair spaces within the seating area on sloping floor and 6 level floor wheelchair spaces at the rear of the stalls. For the hearing impaired we have headsets to give amplification and we aim to screen at least one film a week with subtitles on screen (subject to availability). For the visually impaired audio description is offered through audio headsets. Subtitled screenings and audio described films are listed overleaf with S/T and A/D.

LOCATION & PARKING



We're located in the centre of town on the A646 (Halifax to Burnley road) close to many bus stops and 5 minutes' walk from the railway station. There is no customer parking at the cinema, but on street parking is available nearby and the town has many pay and display car parks. We have one disabled parking space which customers may use when it is available.

Keira Knightley (Atonement, Anna Karenina) gives a career-best performance in Wash Westmoreland's (Still Alice) gorgeous, witty, exhilarating biopic of the pioneering French novelist. In Belle Époque France, Colette's marriage to Henry (Dominic West) thrusts her from the country to the Paris demi-monde. Her first novels are published under her Svengali-like husband's name; but her eventual fight for creative ownership drives her to overcome constraints, revolutionising women's roles in literature as well as sexual expression. Whip-smart, precocious and unapologetic, Colette is recast as a uniquely talented feminist trailblazer, fighting for the ownership of her voice in a male-dominated world.

Hailee Steinfeld stars in Travis Knight's (Kubo and the Two Strings) new sci-fi, a stylish, shimmering take on the Transformers series. On the run in the year 1987, Bumblebee the Autobot seeks refuge in a junkyard in a small California beach town. Teenager Charlie (Steinfeld), on the brink of turning 18 and trying to find her place in the world, soon discovers the battle-scarred and broken Bumblebee and when she revives him, quickly learns that this is no ordinary yellow Volkswagen. But as the two of them run from society, they find out that Bee is not the only Transformer on earth – and that the others may not be as friendly.

THE PASSENGER (12A)

Suspense, intrigue, wit, beauty, ideas: Michelangelo Antonioni's 1975 classic psychological drama has them all in spades. When David Locke (Jack Nicholson) impulsively exchanges identities with a businessman he finds dead in a North African hotel room, he believes he's starting afresh, but soon realises that pretending to be someone else doesn't mean escaping the past. Working from a superb script by Mark Peploe and Peter Wollen, Antonioni creates some of his most memorable scenes and eloquent images: Locke breaking down in the Sahara soliciting help from a tourist (Maria Schneider) in Gaudi's Barcelona, and evading pursuit through the arid landscapes of southern Spain.

Verdi based La Traviata on Alexandre Dumas fils's novel and play La Dame aux camélias, inspired by the life and death of the real Parisian courtesan Marie Duplessis. With their celebrity on the wane, it begins in fairly subdued fashion – but with the support of their formidable wives Lucille (Shirley Henderson) and Ida (Nina Arianda), and encouraged by their inimitable love of performing, they secure an enduring place in the hearts of their public as they head towards a big London finale.

One of the greatest and most terrifying athletic feats imaginable, the climb's exacting standard is perfection or death – and while Honnold is training, he falls in love, threatening his focus and immeasurably raising the stakes. Capturing Honnold's death-defying climbing with masterful, vertigo-inducing camerawork – alongside deeply human and intimate moments – this is a stunning and unforgettable documentary.

Based on the novel by controversial French writer Christine Angot, Catherine Corsini's (Summertime, Leaving) film begins in the 1950s, as office worker Rachel (Virginie Efira) falls for the dashing Philippe (Niels Schneider), a Nietzsche-reading sophisticate. Embarking on a passionate relationship, he nevertheless won't share his life with her, and she raises their daughter alone, before – years later – a darker side of his nature is brought shockingly to light. Superbly performed and directed, this is a hugely impressive work, its meticulous period recreation and potent feminist voice echoing the 1980s films of Diane Kurys, with a formidable central performance from rising star Efira.

MARY QUEEN OF SCOTS (15)

Cast: Margot Robbie, Saoirse Ronan, David Tennant, Jack Lowden, Gemma Chan, Guy Pearce
Saoirse Ronan and Margot Robbie give powerhouse performances in Josie Rourke's vigorous, provocative historical drama, a retelling of the power struggle between two extraordinary women, Elizabeth I and Mary Queen of Scots. Queen of France at 16, widowed at 18, Mary Stuart (Ronan) defies pressure to remarry and returns to her native Scotland to reclaim her throne. But Scotland and England are now ruled by Elizabeth I; and the young queens regard each other with fear and fascination. Rivals in power and in love, female regents in a masculine world, the two must decide how to play the game of marriage versus independence.

TEATIME CLASSICS: LAST TANGO IN PARIS (18)

Famous for its frank, raw portrayal of sexual violence and the (continuing) controversy around both its content and its making, the vivid, naturalistic Last Tango in Paris – by consistently radical filmmaker Bernardo Bertolucci, who died late last year – stars Marlon Brando and Maria Schneider as a middle-aged American widower and a young Frenchwoman who begin an anonymous, purely sexual relationship.

Golden Globe winner for Best Picture (Musical/Comedy) and Best Supporting Actor for Mahershala Ali, Green Book is based on the uplifting true story of an unlikely friendship and explores racial division in '60s America. 1962: Italian-American bouncer Tony (Viggo Mortensen) is hired to chauffeur African-American pianist Don (Ali) around the Deep South. Aware of the racism he will encounter, Don needs a protector and though Tony has his own problematic views, he offers the required muscle. So it is that they embark on a road trip with the potential to change both of their lives, confronting the ugliness of prejudice in an era of segregation.

Rami Malek gives an incredible central performance in this foot-stomping celebration of Queen, their music and extraordinary lead singer Freddie Mercury; who famously defied stereotypes and shattered convention to become one of the most beloved entertainers on the planet. The film traces the meteoric rise of the band through their iconic songs and revolutionary sound; and their unparalleled success, before Freddie departs to pursue a solo career. After suffering without his bandmates, they manage to reunite just in time for Live Aid – and, while bravely facing his recent AIDS diagnosis, Freddie leads the band in one of the greatest rock performances of all time.
