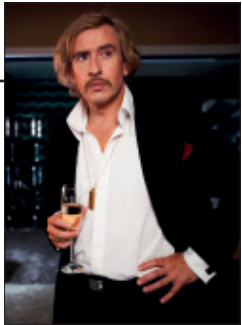

Michael Winterbottom (**24 Hour Party People**) collaborates with Steve Coogan for the fourth time, in this fascinating, witty and at times poignant biopic of Paul Raymond. Dubbed the ‘King of Soho’ by the press due to his huge club and property empire which, along with his adult magazine business, amassed him a fortune of billions of pounds and allowed him to live a lifestyle that was ultimately destructive to all around him. The superb script by Matt Greenhalgh (**Control**, **Nowhere Boy**) contributes to some brilliant performances, with special mention going to Coogan who is on scintillating form.

A HIJACKING (15)

Following on from its successful screening at BIFF 2013, this superbly intelligent and tense drama gets a second outing at the Picture House. **A Hijacking** stars Borgen’s Pilou Asbæk, who here plays the cook on a Danish-registered ship taken hostage by Somali pirates. The focus metronomes back and forth between the vessel and Copenhagen as the owners and hijackers slowly hammer out a deal. Outstanding on every level, **A Hijacking** features a terrific ensemble cast including real-life negotiator Gary Skjoldmose Porter and Søren Malling, best known as Sarah Lund’s abrasive colleague Jan Meyer in **The Killing**.

I’M SO EXCITED (15)

Pedro Almodóvar (**Volver**) makes a return to the broad comedies of his earlier days with this sexually-charged farce set on board a flight to Mexico. Following a technical failure, Peninsula Flight 2549 is held in a holding pattern. The flight attendants and the chief steward try to forget their own personal problems and devote themselves body and soul to the task of making the flight as enjoyable as possible for the passengers, while they wait for a solution. Life in the clouds is as complicated as it is at ground level, and for the same reasons, which could be summarised in two words: sex and death.

Chasing his own American Dream, Nick lands across the bay from his cousin, Daisy (Mulligan), and next door to the mysterious, party-giving millionaire, Jay Gatsby (DiCaprio). As Nick bears witness, within and without of the world he inhabits, he pens a tale of impossible love, incorruptible dreams and tragedy, and holds a mirror to our own modern times and struggles.

Based on the novel by Nobel Prize winner Patrick White, **The Eye of the Storm** is a savage exploration of family relationships, and the sharp undercurrents of love and hate, comedy and tragedy, which define them.

Set in 1950s France, this is the extraordinary tale of Rose (Francois), a village shopkeeper’s daughter who travels to Normandy to try out for a job as a secretary for local lawyer, and bachelor, Louis (Duris). Lacking the grace necessary to perform the role, Rose’s interview is a disaster but reveals a special gift – she is a speed demon on the typewriter! Louis’ competitive spirit is reawakened and he hires Rose and begins an intensive training regime to prepare her to compete in the country’s cut-throat and high profile typing contests.
