THE EVIL DEAD (18)

Dir: Sam Raimi | 1981 | USA | 85 mins
Cast: Bruce Campbell, Ellen Sandweiss, Richard DeManincor

Five friends travel to a cabin in the woods, where they unknowingly release flesh-possessing demons. Raimi’s seminal horror made a cult icon of Bruce Campbell and turned its director into hot property. Much imitated but never bettered, *The Evil Dead* was the birth of an independently-spirited, viscerally-minded new wave in low-budget horror cinema, and is now a recognised classic.

SANTA SANGRE (18)

Dir: Alejandro Jodorowsky | 1989 | Mexico / Italy | 123 mins
Cast: Axel Jodorowsky, Bianca Guerra, Guy Stockwell, Sabrina Dennison, Thelma Tixou

Visionary filmmaker Alejandro Jodorowsky’s avant-garde, surrealist *Santa Sangre* is justifiably adored by cult horror fans. Half flashback, half flash forward, it tells the story of Fenix and his traumatic childhood, spent in a circus; before teaming up with his mother to undertake a grisly campaign of revenge. Full of provocative, psychedelic imagery, explicit violence, eroticism and weird mysticism, it’s an unforgettable watch.

THE SHINING (15)

Dir: Stanley Kubrick | UK | 1980 | 119 mins
Cast: Jack Nicholson, Shelley Duvall, Danny Lloyd, Scatman Crothers

Terrify yourself anew with Stanley Kubrick’s (*A Clockwork Orange*, *Barry Lyndon*) exquisitely crafted psychological horror starring Jack Nicholson as the writer who takes an off-season job as a caretaker at an isolated hotel with his wife (Shelley Duvall) and young son. But as the chef (Scatman Crothers) ominously foretells, it’s a place full of memories, none of which are good.

THE LIVING DEAD AT MANCHESTER MORGUE (18)

Dir: Jorge Grau | 1974 | Italy / Spain | 95 mins
Cast: Cristina Galbó, Ray Lovelock, Arthur Kennedy

This cult 70s Spanish/Italian zombie horror is endlessly inventive. Set in the Lake District it follows hippie-ish George (Ray Lovelock) and Londoner Edna (Cristina Galbó), who find themselves framed for a series of terrifying murders: only to find that these heinous crimes have been committed by the undead... Full of impressive set pieces, it’s beautifully realised, eerie and unconventionally thrilling.

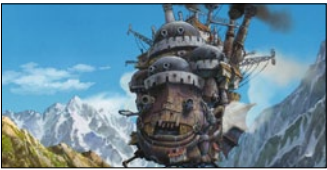

There's a double dose of British star Tom Hardy (*Locke*) playing both Ronnie and Reggie Kray in Brian Helgeland's (Oscar-winning screenwriter of *L. A. Confidential*) vivid, muscular biopic detailing the rise and fall of the notoriously dangerous twin brothers, whose pervasive empire of organised crime – 'The Firm' – terrorised London's East End during the 50s and 60s.

MISTRESS AMERICA (15)*

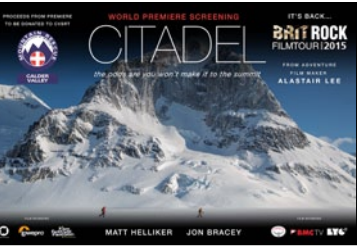

A taut, suspenseful and thrilling drama.

An astonishingly powerful and moving tour-de-force performance from James Cosmo as veteran fighter Ray who talks about his life, career in the ring and physical and emotional scars, while also dwelling on how he can try and reconcile with his estranged son. Shot in black-and-white and set against the backdrop of a gym and boxing ring, the script – by Geoff Thompson – originated on stage, but has been impressively brought to the screen by the Shammasian brothers, Ludwig and Paul.

Watch Meryl Streep rock out in Jonathan Demme's (*Rachel Getting Married*) rambunctious, brilliantly soundtracked and very moving film, scripted by Diablo Cody (*June*). She's singer Ricki, whose peripatetic existence ended her marriage and estranged her from her kids - and now, called on by ex-husband (Kevin Kline), must reunite with her family to help her troubled daughter Julie (played by Streep's daughter Mamie Gummer).



BIG HERO 6 (PG)

This superb Disney animation follows robotics prodigy Hiro Hamada, who learns to harness his curious genius thanks to his brilliant brother Tadashi and their like-minded friends: When a turn of events catapults them into the midst of a dangerous plot, Hiro turns to his closest companion-a robot named Baymax-and transforms the group into a band of high-tech heroes determined to solve the mystery.

SINGIN' IN THE RAIN (U)

Stanley Donen's 1952 musical comedy is a gloriously romantic, airy classic starring Gene Kelly at his quicksilver best, dancing with joyous, effortless charm as silent film star Don Lockwood. It's a story of the arrival of the talkies and the first Hollywood musical - and a romantic love story, as Lockwood finds himself captivated by 'serious' actress Kathy Selden (Reynolds).



STRAIGHT OUTTA COMPTON (15)

Cast: O'Shea Jackson Jr., Corey Hawkins, Jason Mitchell, Keith Jackson, Paul Giamatti
The story of seminal hip hop group N. W. A, whose groundbreaking debut album galvanised youth culture on its 1988 release. Using explicit rhymes and hardcore beats, they gave voice to hood life in southern L. A. in their propulsive, addictive tracks. Straight Outta Compton follows the rise and fall of the group through gang violence, HIV, the L. A. riots and perilous fame.

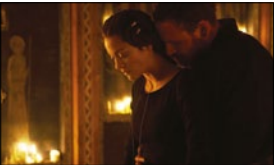

Based on the beloved children's novel, this is a fantastically funny, family-friendly film. Kind-hearted bee Maya can't help but befriend Flip the violin-playing grasshopper, Kurt the dung beetle and even Sting, a young hornet; and when the Queen's royal jelly is stolen, Maya and her bug buddies must figure out who did it to save the day!

MACBETH (15)

Cast: Michael Fassbender, Marion Cotillard, Sean Harris, Paddy Considine, David Thewlis, Elizabeth Debicki
Michael Fassbender and Marion Cotillard headline Justin Kurzel's (*Snowtown*) take on Shakespeare's 'Scottish' play. Fassbender is spellbinding as Macbeth, whose fatally corruptive ambition – instigated by his ruthless wife, Lady Macbeth (Cotillard) – leads him to murder, to power, and into war and psychosis. This is a boldly stylised, visually thrilling adaptation with seriously charismatic performances by Fassbender and Cotillard.



GHOSTHUNTERS (PG)

This hilarious, rambunctious film is set in a world where there's a force dedicated to fighting the paranormal: the Central Ghosthunting Institute. Eleven-year-old Tom is terrified when he meets bright greem, slimy ghost Hugo in his family's cellar. But Hugo's only an ASG (Averagely Spooky Ghost) and needs his help. Teaming up with professional ghosthunter Hetty, they must face an Ancient Ice Ghost.

Documentary
The Palio is the oldest horse race in the world, and turns the Italian city of Siena into a high-stakes battleground of strategy, intrigue, and simmering machismo. In the eye of the storm stand the jockeys – adored if they succeed but despised if they fail. Palio follows legendary maestro Gigi Bruschelli and his former protégé Giovanni Atzeni to expose the notoriously closed world of this epic, ancient race.

From Brazilian director Anna Muylaert comes this immensely appealing, funny, warm and poignant film starring Regina Casé as Val, who's 13 years as a nanny to Fabinho and live-in help to his family in São Paulo when her estranged daughter arrives to stay – creating tensions for Val in her working household, and forcing her to find a new way of facing life.

THE BIG KNIGHTS (U)

From the award-winning animators of *Peppa Pig* comes The Big Knights; a compilation of the best of the brilliant BBC children's series, voiced by Brian Blessed and David Rintoul. Telling the exploits of brothers Sir Boris (the finest swordsman in the world), Sir Morris (the most enthusiastic) and their pets (Sir Horace the Dog and Sir Doris the Hamster) it's endowed with immense wit and charm.



SUFFRAGETTE (12A) *

Cast: Carey Mulligan, Helena Bonham Carter, Anne Marie Duff, Meryl Streep, Ben Whishaw
Carey Mulligan heads a stellar cast including Meryl Streep, Helena Bonham Carter, Romola Garai and Anne-Marie Duff in *Suffragette*, scripted by Abi Morgan (*The Iron Lady*) depicting the British women's suffrage movement. A historic film, full of wonderful performances, this is an urgently compelling drama showing the violent aspects of the suffrage movement and the raw hunger for equality behind it.
