For the first time, they leave the only city and family they have ever known in order to find a peaceful solution. Once outside, they learn shocking new truths. As the ruthless battle threatens humanity, Tris and Four quickly decide who to trust in order to survive, and Tris must ultimately make impossible choices about courage, allegiance, sacrifice and love.

Wade Wilson (Reynolds) is a former Special Forces operative turned mercenary whose world is forever changed when evil scientist Ajax (Ed Skrein) transforms him into Deadpool, a being with accelerated healing powers and a twisted sense of humour. With help from mutant allies Colossus and Negasonic Teenage Warhead, he must use his new skills to hunt down the man who nearly destroyed his life. Vivid, weird, and very funny.


This BAFTA-nominated debut is a superbly brutal, gritty and


Stephan Elliot's brash, liberating road movie follows two drag



Taron Egerton (*Testament of Youth*) is Edwards, who from childhood dreams of Olympic stardom, despite lacking any obvious sporting skill. A very British film about the ultimate underdog, with immense warmth and wit.

Engineer Giorgio (Marcello Pagliero) is trying to evade the Germans and looks to Pina (Anna Magnani) and priest Don Pietro (Aldo Fabrizi) for help. But will they come to his aid, or betray him?


Tom Hiddleston, Sienna Miller,

Hiddleston is excellent as Dr. Robert Laing, seduced by the glamour of his new apartment block before the cracks start to show. Wheatley's film is brave, daring and true to Ballard's anarchic vision.

Disney's latest animation is set in a world that's recognisably human, but populated entirely by animals. From the largest elephant to the smallest shrew, the city of Zootopia is a mammal metropolis. When Judy Hopps (Ginnifer Goodwin) becomes the first rabbit to join the police force, she quickly learns how tough it is to enforce the law. Determined to prove herself, Judy jumps at the opportunity to solve a mysterious case. Unfortunately, that means working with Nick Wilde (Jason Bateman), a wily fox who makes her job even harder. Beautifully designed and voiced, it's also got a pleasingly adult message of social tolerance.
